Why are we talking about suicide?

- For 15 34 year olds, suicide is the second leading cause of death in the US and 10th for all ages.
- 1.4 Gun Suicides for each Gun Homicide in region
 - 4.5 in Minnesota1.7 in Indiana
 - 3.8 in Wiscconsin1.4 in Michigan
 - 1.8 in Ohio .86 in Illinois
- But suicide is generally preventable
- Reducing access to lethal means is effective
- You can play a role whatever your role
- Don't forget to take care of yourself!

Safe Messaging

With Individuals

- Be direct about suicide in talking to a person you believe may be at risk or to their family
- Research shows that you won't be "putting the idea in someone's head".

In Media or the Public

Use care in discussing suicide.

Glamorizing the act, normalizing it or providing details about methods can increase risk among vulnerable people.

Reducing Access to Lethal Means

Make highly lethal means less accessible



Attempt suicide with less lethal means or

Delay suicide attempt

Either way, s/he is more likely to survive

Why does this work?

- Suicide methods vary greatly in terms of their LETHALITY
- Most suicidal people are undecided about choosing death versus choosing life
- The decision to carry out the actual act of suicide is often made very quickly

So, putting time and distance between a suicidal person and lethal means MAY save their life

Pesticides – Sri Lanka

- Pesticides are the leading suicide method in many parts of Asia, with an estimated 300,000 deaths annually worldwide.
- In Sri Lanka, suicide rates rose 8-fold from 1950 to 1995.
- Restrictions were placed on sales of the most highly human-toxic pesticides in the mid to late '90s.
- Suicide rates dropped 50% from 1996 to 2005.
- Nonfatal poisonings and other suicides did not.



Preventability


- 90% of those who die by suicide had some form of mental illness and/or substance abuse – often undiagnosed but often treatable
- Many people who survive a nearly lethal attempt say something like this: "I instantly realized that everything in my life that I'd thought was unfixable was totally fixable – except for having just jumped" from the Golden Gate Bridge
- 90% of those who survive a nearly lethal attempt do not go on to die by suicide

Why Focus on Firearms?


They are:

- The leading method for suicide deaths in the US More than all other methods combined.
- **Highly lethal** Nearly anything an attempter might substitute is less likely to kill them.
- Fast and Irreversible No chance for rescue or change of heart once the trigger is pulled.
- Very Accessible About 1/3 of US homes have at least one gun.

Decision Time

Among survivors of near fatal suicides, when asked about time from their decision to complete suicide and the attempt:

- 24% said less than 5 minutes
- 47% more said an hour or less

Putting time and distance between a suicidal person and lethal means MAY save a life

Firearm Availability

- About 1/3 of US homes have at least one firearm¹
- 82% of youths who died by firearm suicide used a gun owned by a family member usually a parent²
- Parents underestimate the likelihood that their children have or could obtain their firearms.

Steps to CALM Counsel on Access to Lethal Means

- Express your concern directly to client/family using the word SUICIDE
- Inquire about access to firearms and medications (+ other indicated lethal means)
- Inform the client/family that restricting access reduces risk
- Discuss how to accomplish this
- Complete a Safety Plan including ongoing supervision, treatment and follow up
- Communicate and document as appropriate

Reducing Access to Firearms

- Temporarily removing all firearms from the home is the most effective option
- Where to store them?
 - Family and friends (if legally able to have guns)
 - Police in jurisdictions where they are willing*
 - Gun shops and ranges, pawn shops, shooting clubs*

^{*}Background checks and/or fees may apply

Options to reduce access if removing from home isn't possible

- Lock all firearms in a safe or in a lock box.
- Change combinations and/or key locations
- Store all firearms unloaded
- Lock ammunition separately or remove ammunition from the home
- Remove a key component of firearms such as the bolt

What about a self-defense gun?

- First, discuss probabilities of suicide attempt by person at risk versus risk of home invasion
- If self-defense is essential, keep the selfdefense gun either in a quick access lock box or on your person
- If the gun owner is the person at risk, seek creative solutions to reducing access if suicidal. e.g. put pictures of loved ones on the lock box

Reducing Access to Medications

- Remove out of date, unused and excess medications and over the counter remedies (see handout for safe disposal)
- At risk person should not have control of quantities of medication
- Avoid policies that require prescriptions for long periods of time. Short term prescriptions can also provide a check-in for patients

Reducing Access to Other Methods

Suffocation

Difficult to remove all possible means

Focus on maintaining emotional and visual contact and on other parts of the Safety Plan


Other Methods

Reduce access wherever possible


Maintain contact

Accidental Gun Deaths, US




The Gun Shop Project



Start of the Project

- **Three** suicide deaths in **six days** within hours of gun purchase from a single NH gun shop



About 8% of NH Firearm Suicides Used a newly acquired gun

Mission

Engage gun community in suicide prevention

- Educate shops and ranges about steps to avoid selling/renting a firearm to a suicidal customer
- Educate their customers about making firearms less accessible if a friend or family member is suicidal
- Promote National Suicide Prevention Lifeline to link with local crisis centers and other emergency services (1-800-273-TALK)



New Hampshire Firearm Retailers:

Your vigilance could save a life!

Close to one in ten firearm suicides in New Hampshire occur with guns purchased within that same week, usually within *hours*. While not all suicides are preventable, you could reduce the odds that a gun bought at your store today is used in a suicide tomorrow.

Signs that a potential buyer could be suicidal

Note: None of these signs clearly indicate someone is suicidal, but if any are present (especially if more than one is present), use extra caution in deciding whether to proceed with the sale.

- No knowledge about guns AND no interest in learning; asks no questions
- Doesn't care which gun s/he purchases or seem responsive to your questions about the purchase
- Gives unconvincing response when asked what s/he intends to use the gun for
- No interest in firearm maintenance or safety
- Mentions recent crisis, such as a divorce, job loss, or other setback
- Makes comments that could suggest suicidality (e.g. "I don't need a lot of ammunition, I won't
 have the gun for long.")
- Looks anxious, avoids eye contact
- Appears distraught (shaking, fighting back tears)

Options for responding to a potentially suicidal buyer

Notify store owner or manager (if applicable) if at all uncomfortable with a prospective sale






11. Consider temporary off-site storage if a family member may be suicidal. When an emotional crisis (like a break-up, job loss, legal trouble) or a major change in someone's behavior (like depression, violence, heavy drinking) causes concern, storing guns outside the home for a while may save a life. Friends as well as some shooting clubs, police departments, or gun shops may be able to store them for you until the situation improves.

Evaluation


- 60 gun shops visited



FIREARM DEATHS IN COLORADO

Over the past several years, unintentional firearm deaths in Colorado have averaged less than 10 per year, thanks largely to increased awareness of gun safety. Unfortunately, Colorado still has a tragically high number of suicide deaths by firearms - more than 3,367 between 2005 and 2012.



For every unintentional firearm death from 2005-2012, there were approximately 15 firearm homicides and 57 firearm suicides.

The first step to reduce these numbers is to follow the 11 commandments of gun safety. The latest addition addresses suicide prevention. Firearms are the leading method of suicide in Colorado, contributing to about half of all suicides.
